Sukkot, meaning "Huts," recalls the Divine protection that surrounded our ancestors in the desert. Called Z'man Simchateinu, the Time of Our Rejoicing, it is celebrated by dwelling and eating in the sukkah, taking the Four Species - lulav, etrog, hadasim and aravot - and rejoicing.
